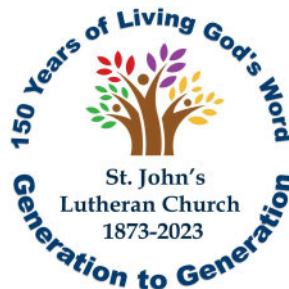

# Enough

*Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity*

One of Jesus' great teaching parables involves a sower who cast seed along the ground. The sower hoped the seeds would sprout, grow, and bear good fruit. Some seeds did just that, producing a great harvest. But others, Jesus said, fell among thorns and, though they began to grow, these good plants were quickly choked out. Jesus said the thorns were "the cares of the world and the lure of wealth" (Matthew 13:22).

In a culture where having "enough" seems to have become a never-ending pursuit, Jesus' parable remains incredibly relevant. Many of us are chasing the American dream in ways that lead to stress, anxiety, and fear—thorns that can rob us of the ability to enjoy the abundant lives of purpose that God intended for us.

All of us have struggled with these issues at one time or another. They are important issues that we cannot ignore. This is why, over the course of five weeks, starting in October, we will be having a churchwide study and worship emphasis called *Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity*. During this time, we will explore what the Bible teaches us about financial management through worship and conversations. We'll hear advice and stories about what others have learned by working through financial challenges. Each week we will provide you with some practical tools you can use to assess your financial situation and develop a financial plan with a biblical foundation.

At the conclusion of the emphasis, we will have the opportunity to make personal commitments of our offerings to God through our church in the coming year. We will consecrate these commitments in the worship service Sunday, November 3, 2024. (See the schedule that follows.)

We hope you will join us in the coming weeks as we look at how we can manage our financial resources and truly experience simplicity, generosity, and joy.

# Ecumenical Partnership *for* Housing



*"Give Them Roots and Create Wings"*

The **EPH** Board of Directors voted unanimously to accept St. John's Lutheran Church of Little Suamico into their fold and to accept Bruce Russell as St. John's representative and new Board Member. As a result, St. John's has now adopted one side of a duplex used to provide housing for a family with children experiencing homelessness.

Ecumenical Partnership for Housing (EPH) is a nonprofit organization, 501(c)(3) working in partnership with 22 area churches to serve local families with children facing homelessness by providing housing, case management, and eviction prevention services.

St. John's will be looking for volunteers to help get the home ready for a new family to move into each time it becomes vacant by cleaning, decorating, and stocking it with supplies. All are supplied by EPH. We will also help with lawn care and snow removal. Please prayerfully consider helping when the need arises or stepping up as a coordinator who will help plan when the time/need arises.

EPH provides housing support in three areas:

1. Short term Transitional support (for families up to 1 year)
2. Long term support (up to 3 years)
3. Support for families facing possible eviction

Recently EPH families were surveyed. When families residing in our transitional or long-term supportive housing programs were asked, "What do you feel has improved since residing in your housing program?" The number one answer was **Budgeting**. That was no surprise as each family participates in budget counseling through our partnership with Catholic Charities for the length of their stay in an EPH home. However, we were pleased to learn that **Stabilized Mental Health** was the second highest response, and **Improved Family Relationships** was third.

A shout out to the Council of St. John's and to you for supporting EPH and providing families experiencing homelessness with a safe place to call home and the opportunity to address their overall well-being as they work towards self-sufficiency.

## Home-Canned Items Needed For Fall Bazaar

The canning season is here, which means the bazaar is not that far away! The Canned Goods area is a popular stop for the Bazaar shoppers. Needed canned goods are jams, jellies, pickles, fruit sauces, salsa and anything else that can be canned safely. When you're canning, if you can set aside a dozen (or more!) for the Bazaar, it would be appreciated.

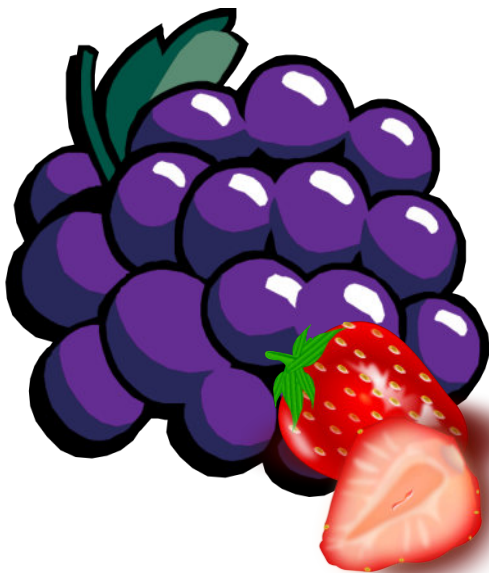
Between 50-60 dozen are needed.

To keep the product consistent and safe, here are a few guidelines:

- Use standard canning jars: 8 oz. for jams and jellies, pint and quart for pickles, etc. (brand unimportant).
- Seal with ring/lid (brand unimportant).
- Jars should be filled, i.e., no gap from top of product to bottom of ring.
- Jams, jellies, preserves, etc. should be soft set (jiggles like Jello) or firm set (no jiggle). That pesky batch that didn't set can always be sold as a topping!

For product safety use FDA water bath processing guidelines.

**The Bazaar canners recycle:** empty jars and rings in good condition can be used over and over and help keep costs down. Bring them to church during August and September and the canners will fill them up again.
